SHARON FEIMAN-NEMSER is the Mandel Professor of Jewish Education at Brandeis University and director of the Mandel Center for Studies in Jewish Education.

Before coming to Brandeis, Sharon was a Professor of Teacher Education at Michigan State University where she served as Senior Researcher with several national research centers. A leading scholar of teacher education, she has written extensively about mentoring, new teacher induction, teacher learning and the curriculum and pedagogy of teacher education. Her recent book, *Transforming Teacher Education: Reflections from the Field*, written with colleagues from Michigan State, was published in 2007 by Harvard Education Press.
